HERE'S WHAT I GOT in 3.67 years of ownership:

- 1 A very leaky structure with a rotten floor.
- 2 NO attention to detail.
- 3 Nearly all appliances, structures and systems have broken or failed
- 4 A trailer that has worn out and requires restoration.
- 5 A trailer that broke down within four years.
- 6 A trailer that is below it's fair resale value.
- 7 Is 3.67 years really standing the test of time?
